## **Kuali Academic Planning**

Status: Available Second Quarter 2015 (see Roadmap)

Kuali Student Academic Planning (KSAP) is a flexible online tool that allows students to plan their college coursework. Students search for classes from an embedded course/class search. After planning, students can seamlessly move planned courses to a registration cart or utilize the schedule build tool. Students can receive feedback and recommendations from advisors.

KSAP provides the tools and workspaces where a student can plan their academic career. Students are able to:

- Search for approved courses
- Search for offered classes
- Facilitates both short term and long term planning
- Audit planned courses against their degree requirements
- See classes they have already completed
- See classes for which they are registered
- Build a schedule based on anticipated courses using the Schedule Build tool
- Move to the registration process to enroll in classes

KSAP also facilitates advisor and student interaction.

## **Kuali Curriculum Management**

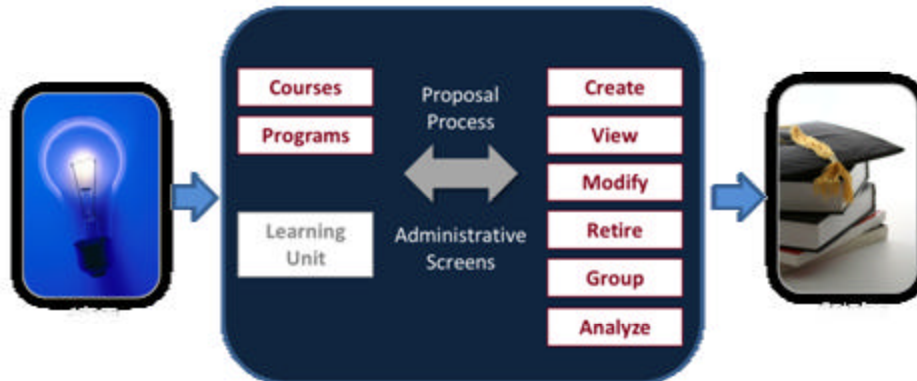
Status: KS CM 2.0.2 community contributed patch release is scheduled for Oct. 2013  
KS CM 3.0 Founders Release is scheduled for release mid 2014

Curriculum management provides the structure and facilitates creation and modification of the curricular catalog including:

- Automated workflow and approval for proposals
- User initiated course creation, modification and retirement
- User initiated program modification
- Administrative functionality for all curricular elements, including version control
- Rules that relate courses to each other and to programs
- Learning objectives that document and categorize the fundamental goals for learning.

Additionally, CM provides enhanced user interaction for:

- Searching, including the use of keyword search in titles and description
- Viewing the interdependencies among curricular elements
- Managing sets of courses that function as a curricular whole
- Comparing course and program versions with highlighted differences



## Kuali Enrollment

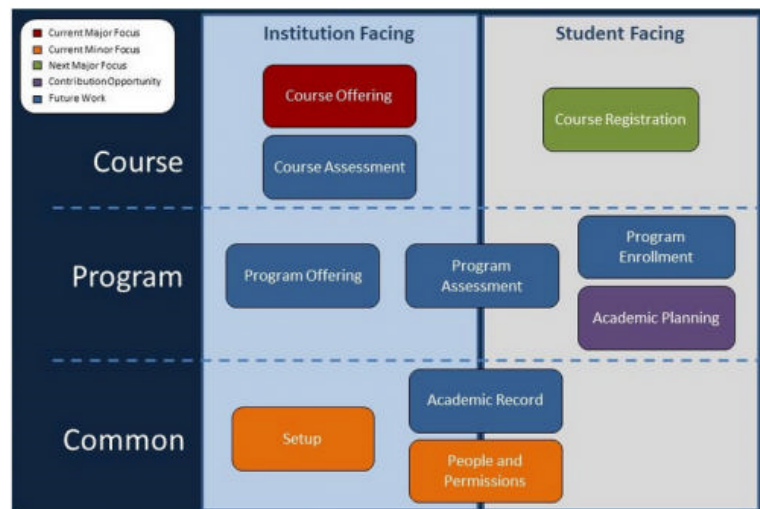
Status: Founders release of KS Course Offering is scheduled for December 2013.

Modules:

- Course Offering
- Registration
- Course Assessment
- Program Offering and Enrollment
- Program Assessment
- Academic Record



Kuali Student Enrollment is a broad and full set of modules that form the core and heart of any student information system. Building on the “learning units” concepts of Curriculum

Management, it provides functionality for a schedule of classes, registration in those classes, program enrollment, course and program assessment, and grading and transcripts. Designed for incremental implementation, these modules allow an institution to create a full student system in the fashion and timeframe they need.

## Student Accounts

Status: Founders release available December 2013 (see Roadmap)

The Student Accounts module is the student financial services component built to support student accounting needs including tuition, room and board charges, financial aid credits and subsequent billing statements. This module will also interface summary data to the general ledger

It consists of the following key business processes:

- Receivables Management
- Payment Billing (Installments Plans)
- Fee Management (Tuition and Fee calculation)
- Third Party Billing (Sponsorship Plans)
- Collections Management
- Robust and flexible automatic payment application.

## Future Offerings

### Program (Degree) Audit

The Program (Degree) Audit module manages the evaluation of learning experiences and the results that are derived from those experiences. These results will be used to answer questions related to the determination of academic standing, academic risk, semester or commencement honors, etc. and readiness to graduate.

### Scheduling

The Scheduling module facilitates the optimization of scheduling various resources required to deliver the curriculum. Resources include such things as courses, exams, instructors, class rooms, facilities, and any other type of resource that one might need to schedule. It consists of the following key business processes:

- Maintain inventory of resources
- Maintain criteria and constraints



- Create schedules

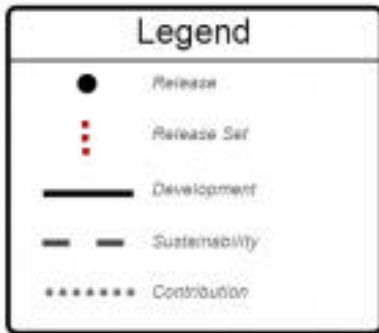
## **Financial Aid**

The Financial Aid module includes all the processes to manage internal and external awards and loans. It will support all applicable legislative and government requirements and regulations. It also tracks external loans on behalf of other awarding agencies.

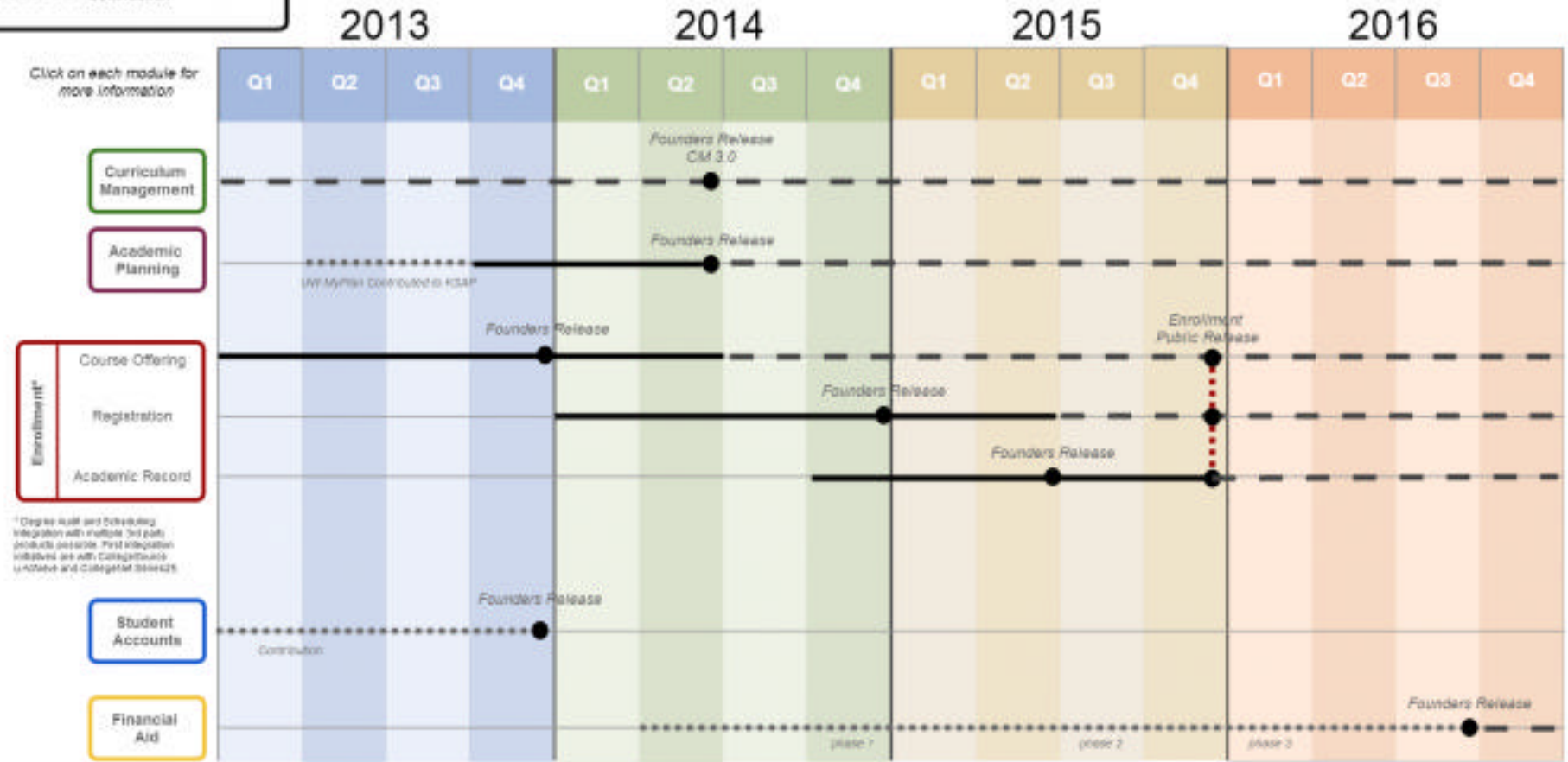
## **Admission**

The Admission module matches prospective learners (called prospects or applicants) with learning activities (such as programs or courses) that an institution offers. The various processes (apply, acknowledge, evaluate and select) can be connected with workflow. It consists of the following business key processes:

- Apply for Admission
- Acknowledge Application
- Maintain Academic History;
- Maintain Non-Academic History
- Evaluate applicant
- Select successful candidates
